Thank you very much for your reply. It means a lot to us knowing that yourself and the District of Invermere is in favour of seeing such a school open in Invermere. The francophone schools are part of the BC public education system and fall under School District 93.

I don't have more info about the funding but I can certainly try to find out.

At this stage we are still trying to find out if there are enough Francophone families in the Invermere area who would qualify for the Francophone program.

I have a list of all the kids and their date of births. So far, I am not sure we have enough kids in a same age group to open a school but I will definitely submit our application and see what the Francophone School District says about it.

We might not qualify this time, but we might next year. The deadline is January 31st.

I will of course keep you updated of the situation.
