Dear Stakeholders,

I am writing to followup my January 2017 and June 2017 letters regarding the interchange at 216th in Langley, on the north side of Highway 1.

As I understand it, there has been progress in that a new Health Impact Assessment (HIA) is now being planned. I am happy to hear this, given that I did previously advocate for an HIA for several reasons previously detailed.

At this point, I would encourage the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure to make that HIA a *comprehensive* one. This is very important because of the dynamics of the 216 interchange moving forward. In particular, the actual increase in traffic volumes, pollution (air and noise) emissions, and other health-related variables is difficult to predict. Even the best models leave considerable uncertainty and so I believe it is incumbent on this process, for best diligence, for the HIA to be comprehensive.

This could (and I believe should) be very important in any decisions regarding the extent to which 216th is part of the Major Road Network. Related decisions should rely substantially on an ongoing



(comprehensive) and robust HIA.

In summary, while I do think that the interchange was poorly considered from the outset (in terms of proximity to the schools and homes of that community), I am encouraged that the seriousness of my concerns, and indeed those of the local community, seem to have resonated in terms of the Ministry agreeing to an HIA. Now I strongly encourage the Ministry to make that HIA robust and comprehensive, to protect the health of local British Columbians.
